Home Communication Club



Home Communication Club (HCC) offers families with deaf children British Sign Language Lessons within the home.

Curriculum covered is family based to meet the needs of your child. HCC are flexible with what is taught, we meet at a time that suits you and the sessions are not limited to immediate family members only. We would love to see Nanny, Grandad, neighbours and whoever plays an important part in your child's life involved in the lessons. HCC provides 10 initial one hour free sessions. Further sessions can be requested, however a donation may be asked depending on your situation.

About me - Yasmena Waris

Hello, my name is Yasmena Waris. I was born and brought up in Buckinghamshire and the eldest of 5 siblings. I am deaf and use both English and BSL in my everyday life. I received my cochlear implant in September 2016.

Prior to that, I was wearing the huge Phonak hearing aids and still remember the name of my very first set of hearing aids! I have fond memories of my Teachers of the Deaf and was integrated in mainstream schools with their generous support.

I graduated with a degree in Linguistics and educational studies and shortly after that, I completed my teaching degree in primary education. In 2004, I qualified as a Teacher of the Deaf and have worked in Deaf Education for over 20 years.

My son was born in 2005 and he too navigated his way through the deaf education system. I have a few different roles within the deaf community. I work predominately in a peripatetic role in London with deaf children in a range of educational settings.



I remember getting involved with YDA when I was a young and its great to see that it still exists after many years. Those fantastic trips and annual Christmas plays brings happy memories!

HCC is also a service that continues to be offered to families with opportunities to meet deaf role models and gain valuable sign language skills. It's been a huge privilege to support families and feel part of their journey. HCC aims to support families to see the positives of deafness and to build confidence and aspirations and most importantly to become empowered in advocating for their children.

Throughout my 20 years of working as an HCC tutor there is never a dull moment and there is no job that is more fulfilling than working with families and supporting their communication skills.

A Deaf Role Model

"Be confident, don't be too fearful when you ask, and embrace your talents"

I can honestly say that I have sometimes struggled with the hearing environment but one thing I never forget is that I cannot enrol in Creative Media Level Three because it requires audio, such as music and sound, as part of the qualification structure. However, I am fortunate that someone supported me in fighting against this discrimination, acknowledged the legislation that protects my rights, and successfully enrolled in Creative Media Level Three despite BSL (British Sign Language) being my first language.

When I created a short film about a Deaf documentary for my Final Major Project (FMP) in 2023, which was the culmination of Level Three, it became one of my best memories. The short film included full-access features such as BSL (British Sign Language), subtitles, and voiceover. Despite encountering some audio issues, my BSL interpreter and I worked tirelessly together, and it turned out to be a successful endeavour.



When I left BCA College in May 2023, I thought I would receive my certificate in August 2023, but it only arrived this week - January 2024, much later than anticipated. I was relieved because I felt that if it was lost, all my hard work would not be recognised. When I finally received it, I was delighted because I had successfully earned all three certificates for Levels One, Two and Three, and they all had a distinction!


Now, I believe BCA College has become more open-minded towards Deaf students who attend the college. When I first arrived there, most staff were nervous because I was the first Deaf student studying Creative Media. I have shown them that I achieved Levels Two and Three there, so I hope they become even more encouraging and that more deaf people choose to attend BCA College in the future.

I have some great tips for you! Be confident, don't be too fearful when you ask, and embrace your talents. Show your skills to everyone and work as hard as you can. Let's strive to make colleges a better system for the Deaf community, where opportunities are accessible to all.




























Halloween
